## GAYS IN THE MILITARY

February 5-10, 2010

A 59% majority of Americans now supports allowing homosexuals to serve in the U.S. military, up from 42% in 1993 (when the debate over allowing gay people to serve first arose early in Bill Clinton's presidency), but down 8 points from one year ago. The percentage that strongly opposes it has dropped significantly since 1993.

In his State of the Union address last month, President Barack Obama vowed to end the policy that bars gay and lesbians from serving openly in the military - commonly referred to as "Don't Ask, Don't Tell."

Americans now divide over whether homosexuals should be allowed to serve openly in the military. In 1993, a majority was opposed.

Question wording impacts views on this subject. When the phrase "gay men and lesbians" is used instead of "homosexuals," support for permitting them to serve in the military increases.

There is a similar effect when it comes to whether gay people should serve openly. When referred to as "homosexuals," 44% favor allowing them to serve in the military openly. When referred to as "gay men and lesbians," that percentage rises to 58%.

This poll was conducted among a random sample of 1,084 adults nationwide, interviewed by telephone February 5-10, 2010. Phone numbers were dialed from random digit dial samples of both standard land-line and cell phones. The error due to sampling for results based on the entire sample could be plus or minus three percentage points. The error for subgroups is higher.
