AFGHANISTAN AND IRAN

October 5-8, 2009

Not only is there debate within the Obama Administration as to what direction the war in Afghanistan should take, but there is also division among Americans on whether U.S. troop levels in Afghanistan should be increased or decreased. The public gives President Barack Obama - now weighing military strategy and options in Afghanistan - his lowest approval rating ever on handling the situation there: 42%. However, his overall job approval rating of 56% is unchanged since last month.

This poll was conducted before the announcement that President Obama was the winner of this year's Nobel Peace Prize.

AFGHANISTAN

Debate over what to do in Afghanistan continues in Congress and within the Obama Administration, and fewer Americans are backing the status quo in regards to troop levels. 37% of Americans want troop levels in Afghanistan increased, while 38% want them decreased -- both of those numbers have risen since last month. Meanwhile, the percentage who wants troop levels kept as they are has dropped ten points since last month to 17% now.

Democrats want troop levels decreased, while Republicans want them increased. Independents are divided.

Approval of how President Obama is handling Afghanistan has slowly dropped over the past six months - now 42% of Americans approve, while 34% disapprove. One in four doesn't have an opinion. Back in April a clear majority of 58% approved of how the president was handling Afghanistan.

The President's approval rating on this issue has dropped almost thirty points among Republicans since April.

However, the war itself, begun under a Republican administration, gets more support from Republicans than Democrats. Most Republicans think the U.S. is doing the right thing by fighting in Afghanistan, while more Democrats think the U.S. should not be involved there now.

Overall, the percentage of Americans that believes the U.S. is doing the right thing by fighting the war in Afghanistan rose slightly: now 51% think so, while 39% do not. Last month Americans were more closely divided.

IRAN

A clear majority of Americans supports attempts at a diplomatic solution in dealing with Iran - the policy currently being pursued by the Obama Administration. 57% of Americans think Iran is a threat that can be contained with diplomacy. 19% think that Iran is a threat that requires military action now, a number that has risen slightly from the 13% recorded last February.

This poll was conducted among a random sample of 829 adults nationwide, interviewed by telephone October 5-8, 2009. Phone numbers were dialed from random digit dial samples of both standard land-line and cell phones. The error due to sampling for results based on the entire sample could be plus or minus three percentage points. The error for subgroups is higher.
