CONCERNS ABOUT THE BUDGET DEFICIT

July 24-28, 2009

Americans have historically been concerned about budget deficits, and they continue to be in a CBS News/New York Times Poll out today. More are in favor - in general - of reducing the budget deficit than spending more money to stimulate the economy.

THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SHOULD...

There are partisan differences on this matter. Republicans (79%) and independents (59%) support focusing on deficit reduction, while nearly half of Democrats (48%) favor spending more to stimulate the economy.

But while they support the principle of reducing the budget deficit, many are not willing to have the government provide fewer services in areas such as health care, education, and defense spending to do that, nor are they willing to pay more in taxes to meet that goal.

TO REDUCE THE DEFICIT, WOULD YOU BE WILLING TO...?

This poll was conducted among a random sample of 1050 adults nationwide, interviewed by telephone July 24-28, 2009. Phone numbers were dialed from random digit dial samples of both standard land-line and cell phones.
