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**AMERICANS' VIEWS OF SARAH PALIN**

November 13-15, 2009

As former Vice Presidential candidate Sarah Palin prepares for her book tour, she continues to receive net negative ratings from the American public. Most do not want to see her run for president, and a majority is skeptical that she has the ability to serve as president effectively. And while Sarah Palin is viewed favorably overall by Republicans, their opinions are mixed when it comes to her possible presidential ambitions.

23% of Americans now hold a favorable view of Sarah Palin, but more - 38% - view her unfavorably. These numbers are similar to opinions held by Americans last summer, when Palin announced she was resigning as Governor of Alaska. A sizable number continue to be undecided or say they haven't heard enough about her to offer an opinion.

Sarah Palin is a polarizing figure. She is popular among members of her own political party - 52% of Republicans view the former Alaska governor favorably - but 57% of Democrats have an unfavorable opinion of her. Independents also have a net negative view of Palin. 41% of conservatives view her positively, as do 47% of white evangelicals.

Two in three Americans would not like to see Sarah Palin run for president in 2012, while a quarter would like her to enter the race. Republicans are divided as to whether they want Palin to run: 48% don't want her to, while 44% want to see her run. Among white evangelicals, who often vote in strong numbers in Republican primaries, views are also mixed: 48% would like Sarah Palin to run for president in 2012, but 42% would not.

Whether Sarah Palin decides to throw her hat in the ring or not, most Americans (62%) do not think she would have the ability to be an effective president; just 26% think she would. The public's views are similar to what they were last summer.

43% of Republicans think the former Vice Presidential candidate would be an effective president, up 10 points from last summer, but 39% of them are not convinced.

Among white evangelicals, half think Palin would be an effective president and 46% of conservatives agree.

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This poll was conducted among a random sample of 873 adults nationwide, interviewed by telephone November 13-15, 2009. Phone numbers were dialed from random digit dial samples of both standard land-line and cell phones. The error due to sampling for results based on the entire sample could be plus or minus three percentage points. The error for subgroups is higher.
