ORDER ON INITIAL APPEARANCE AND ORDER  
SCHEDULING DETENTION HEARING AND PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

On the 2nd day of April 2012, in the above-referenced cause, defendant CLAYTON FREDERICK OSBON appeared in person with retained counsel, Mr. E. Dean Roper, and Mr. Thomas Riney, before the undersigned United States Magistrate Judge for the purpose of his Initial Appearance in accordance with Rule 5, Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure. The United States appeared by and through the Assistant United States Attorney for the Northern District of Texas.

In accordance with Rule 5, the defendant received a copy of the Complaint that had been filed against him in this cause, and acknowledged that he understood same. The defendant was advised of his rights relative to the making and the refusal to make statements which might be used against him and acknowledged that he understood such rights. The defendant was further advised of his right to retain counsel and of his right to request the Court to appoint counsel to represent him free of charge if he is unable to afford to retain counsel. The defendant acknowledged that he understood his right to counsel, and advised that he had retained Mr. Roper, and Mr. Riney to represent him in this cause.

At the Initial Appearance, the government filed a Motion for Pretrial Detention alleging there are no conditions of release which will reasonably assure the safety of any other person and the community. The defendant was advised of his right to a Preliminary Examination, and a Detention Hearing, and acknowledged that he understood such right. The defendant's Preliminary Examination, and Detention Hearing will be held at **9:30 a.m., Thursday, April 5, 2012**, in the First Floor Courtroom, 205 East Fifth Street, Amarillo, Texas.

Defendant CLAYTON FREDERICK OSBON was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal pending further proceedings.

IT IS ORDERED that the defendant be committed to the custody of the Attorney General for confinement in a corrections facility separate, to the extent practicable, from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the defendant be afforded reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that on Order of a Court of the United States or on request of an attorney for the United States, the person in charge of the corrections facility in which the defendant is confined shall deliver the defendant to the United States Marshal for the purpose of appearances in connection with Court proceedings.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
