After watching your report on Lou Dobbs, I felt it necessary to respond to Mr. Dobbs characterization of a meeting he had with the Congressional Hispanic Caucus (CHC), of which I am a member.

The purpose of the meeting was to have a constructive conversation about the issue of immigration and to raise concerns about the content and tone of his reporting. For Mr. Dobbs to suggest that we spent our time discussing his culinary preferences is foolish and wrong.

We need immigration reform in this country. That Mr. Dobbs and I agree on. Unfortunately, Mr. Dobbs' actions make it more difficult for serious people on both sides of the aisle to get this done because of his desire to obfuscate this debate.

I think your reporting shined a light on his form of advocacy, without accuracy, journalism, and I appreciate this opportunity to comment on his mischaracterization of our meeting.
